6. Office Bearer Reports

6.1. Hridey Kapoor

Within the past month, our department has been working hard to deliver some amazing initiatives for students. We have also run a couple of events since the last committee meeting, which were a good success. The first event was the Trivia Night, in collaboration with the Queer Commerce Club. This was a social event that allowed students to break away from the everyday stress, through competing in teams to win some fun prizes. We also held our flagship alumni networking panel, which was one of our most successful events this year. We invited 7 guest panelists to provide their insights on life after university, the graduate job hunt and how students can make themselves more employable. The event had a strong attendance, with quite a few walk-ins and this networking opportunity will go a long way in helping students understand life after university. The opportunity to connect with individuals from a range of industries is invaluable. On the campaigns front, the Education Public department has continued to advocate for the improvement of charging facilities at university, through a Power bank system. The focus has shifted to Southbank, because the department feels that launching the program there will be smoother and is more important.

6.2. Corbin Afanasyev and Hesheya Anandan

After protracted negotiation with SASS as well as GSA and UMSUi, we have secured another trial of the 24h study space for SWOTVAC of this semester.

To contrast with 2025, this will be in the ERC library rather than the after hours space in Baillieu, and will involve access to Building 168 across the skybridge, allowing students to use the microwaves, vending machines and hot water taps. We hope this trial will be successful but the main challenge will be to communicate this amenity to the disengaged student body.

We have also hosted a brand new University of Melbourne alumni panel – titled “From Uni to Industry” - bringing in professionals at various stages in their careers to talk to students about prospective pathways after University.

We have also continued to negotiate the exam schedule release date, and have gotten the University to commit to a discovery piece to review the current timeline and whether it would be feasible to move it forward by 2027, allowing students to have clarity on their exam timetable earlier in the semester. Moreover, we have raised and discussed the accessibility of 8:30 exams and the possibility of having exams start at 9:00 at the earliest for semester 2, to improve access for outer suburban and rural students with long commutes.

6.3. Rutvi Tolani

Hridey and I Reached out to libraries regarding portable chargers and explored ways to improve accessibility for students. Although libraries weren’t very enthusiastic, so we plan to promote portable chargers in just rowdy library which already has so students are more aware and reach out today outback campus. Successfully secured 24/7 access to ERC Library during Swotvac week through our budget allocation to support all students during exams. Hosted a Pitch Night where students presented ideas and solutions for common university problems, encouraging innovation and student engagement. Also co-hosted with Hridey Corbin and Hesheya the alumni networking event “From Uni to Industry” where panelists shared valuable insights and personal experiences about transitioning from university life into industry which was a pretty successful event.
