Enviro Collective

Collective is still going strong. Our second meeting saw a turnout of about 20 people (hooray for the second week slump) and lots of passionate folk chalking, postering, and painting for the upcoming strike. We hope that meetings will continue to have high attendance as we turn to focus on Rad Ed Week at our next collective, and look to the upcoming Sustainable Investment Framework report for long-awaited results (expected around May 2019).

A note on funding for the Enviro Collective: it's cheap for a reason. Enviro Collective is a place for passionate people who want to make a change in our local (and global) environment. These people are there to give their energies to a larger project - whatever that may be. Often small snacks are there to keep those people going; but they are not the drawcard, nor the central part. This is notably different to autonomous collectives, whose mission is substantially different to ours (and arguably more important). They provide a place for people to feel respected and safe in their identity, and a sense of solidarity and nurture. Rich and nourishing food is an important part of this. As far as Enviro can tell, that tends to be more expensive than a few snacks.

School Strike 4 Climate

As this report is being written, SS4C will be taking place tomorrow. To date, the UniMelb Spreading the Climate Strike group has postered almost the entire Parkville campus, spoken at several key lectures, and produced some rad banners to be flown on the day. For many new members of our collective, this is their first time preparing for and taking part in organising a broad-based walk off. We're super excited for the strike and you should be too!

6. Motions on Notice

Motion: Approving funding for upcoming Rad Ed Week events.

Preamble

Radical Education Week will be taking place in the middle of semester, approximately three weeks from now. Rad Ed week is a fabulous week of workshops and conversations about radical ideas, theory, and how to re-vision our broken education & social systems. We organised this week every year to engage student in radical learning "outside the university classroom" - symbolised by the location of our marquee on South Lawn from Monday through to Thursday.

This year like last, we want to try and get more UMSU Departments on board, rather than it just being an Enviro and our friends series, and engage more students in radical ideas. Last year we had workshops from Welfare, Queer, Women's, Education Public and Academic, and People of Colour. This year we want to continue that.

This year we will be running the radical classroom from Monday 15th April to Thursday 18th April (Week 7), with a student forum on Tuesday evening and a closing party taking place on the Thursday. Throughout the week, the radical classroom will be providing workshops, movie screenings, lunch and chats with a range of themes. Some workshops from previous years have been 'Divestment 101', 'Radical Pedagogy', 'The Lost Subjects', 'Anti-racism 102 and 102', 'Reimagining Consent', and 'Glyn Davis: A Life'. Topics range from feminism to circular economies and more.

\$2000 funding for the week will cover catering (from the food co-op, and from external organisations) and AV (projector + speakers), as well as printing materials, the compensation of workshop facilitators, and the booking of the Ida Bar for the final night's party (including a bar tab).

Motion: Approving funding for upcoming Student Sustainability Forum

Preamble

In conjunction with Rad Ed Week, Enviro in collaboration with the Sustainability Executive will be hosting a 'Sustainability Forum' for students and community members at the university. This will be an opportunity for all of the community to get a better grasp of how sustainability is tracking at the University and to have our voices heard especially in relation to the upcoming Divestment Report (expected May).

We have already booked G06 (formerly Elisabeth Murdoch Theatre A), an accessible venue with capacity for up to 200, for the night. It will take place on Tuesday 16th April, with drinks in the foyer starting at 6.15pm. We will provide light (non-alcoholic) refreshments and nibbles from the catering company Sorghum Sisters, who covered our Summerfest catering.

\$1000 funding for the event should cover catering and drinks (from Sorghum Sisters) and any additional printing, promotional, or AV-related costs.

The MUCG (MU Community Garden) has been busy these past weeks and has spent a lot of money - for which they are looking for reimbursements. These are all necessary spending and were chosen by the Garden's elected co-convenors, Mimm and Clare.

Items:

- Recent plant purchases = \$114.49
- Purchase of AIATSIS recognition plaque for the recognition of the Wurundjeri as traditional owners of MUCG lands + waters = \$55.00

Motion: Passing funding for new shelving/storage equipment to assist with cleaning up the clothes swap.

Preamble

The gender-free clothes swap is a great initiative but is also a messy one. We have been constrained in the past by lack of storage space and are looking to get some new (non broken) hangers for the clothes left with the swap.

This will come from Ikea or op-shops, where racks will cost around \$50 each, plus shelving a similar amount. Also including the transport or shipping of these furniture items, we estimate a cost of \$200 to be taken from the special projects events budget line.

Motion 8: To pass up to \$200 of funding form the special projects events budget line for new shelving and racks for the clothes swap.

Motion: New high-vis vests for safety of Environment Collective at events like the School Strike, where properly navigating traffic-heavy or densely-peopled spaces is paramount to safety & accessibility.

Preamble

We found at our SS4C contingent that marshalls with high-vis vests would have been useful not only to direct the speed/direction of the contingent, but to assist with the safety and accessibility of the event. Vests cost around \$20 each at Bunnings and we're looking to buy four.

Motion 9: To pass up to \$100 from stationery + office supplies budget line for the purchase of high-vis vests for the Enviro office.

Motion: An Enviro Office Megaphone to be used at future rallies & events.

Preamble

Similar to our SS4C contingent, we found that a functional megaphone (the one supplied by NUS was malfunctioning) for the marshalling of collective members and the facilitations of protest chants would have been useful. This would improve both safety and impact of future protest marches, as well as being useful for marshalling at any events with large attendance. After doing some research, we found the cost of a megaphone at Bunnings to be around \$150.

Motion 10: To pass up to \$150 funding from Campaign A (FFMU) budget line for an office megaphone to be used at rallies, marches, and actions for the safety of all attendees.
