8.1. Racism at Unimelb Report 2023

Mohammed spoke to the Racism at Unimelb Report 2023. He noted that the university has failed to recognise that there is racism. He also noted that we are a bit archaic in reporting and responding, and that UMSU needs to stay on this issue. There have been 700 responses to the survey.

University is feeling the heat, UMSU's People of Colour Department will be working more collaboratively with the university in the new year, a POC-led consultancy has been appointed.

The key recommendation expressed from the Report is that the university should acknowledge there is racism on campus.

A question was asked about whether the university is accepting the recommendation. Mohamed responded that the university has been convoluted in accepting recommendations, so OBs need to push on this.

A question was asked about how can other departments make same impact? Mohammed responded that he mailed a copy of the Report to all Faculty Deans. Hiba tabled the Report in every meeting that she was in. She reiterated the importance of continuing to apply pressure on the University.

The need to preserve the heritage of the Corkman has already been recognised by the Minister in her draft ruling, as reported in The Age on November 6th, requiring the Corkman's historic facade to be rebuilt by its developers. If the venue's facade should be preserved, then so should its function.
