#### **3.1. Students Council endorses and adopts UMSU Campaign Against Repression of Pro-Palestine Protest Working Group (Protest WG)'s Terms of Reference**

Preamble:

At the 9(25) meeting of Students' Council, UMSU opposed all forms of restriction and punishment imposed upon students exercising their right to peaceful protest and condemned the repression of pro-Palestine voices on campus. Students Council directed that UMSU use all available avenues to end the repression of pro-Palestine activists on campus, to overturn the Vice-Chancellor Rules made on 16 May 2024 and 3 March 2025, and to defend the right to protest on campus.

On Thursday 9 October, the Working Group formed by Students' Council to progress this campaign met and agreed by consensus to adopt the attached Terms of Reference and the aims therein.

Platform:

Students' Council endorses and adopts the UMSU Campaign Against Repression of Pro-Palestine Protest Working Group's Terms of Reference, effective immediately.

Action:

Students' Council directs that the General Secretary cause the Terms of Reference to be published on the UMSU website, by close of business on 24 October 2025.

Lottie exercised moving rights. Lottie added that the first meeting of the UMSU Campaign Against Repression of Pro-Palestine Protest Working Group (Protest WG) was productive and led to the creation of the terms of reference.

### **3.2. UMSU calls a rally opposing the University's repression of peaceful pro-Palestine protest, to be held on Wednesday, 22 October 2025**

Preamble:

UMSU calls on the Vice-Chancellor to rescind the chilling anti-protest Vice-Chancellor Rules made on 16 May 2024 and 3 March 2025.

Action:

1. UMSU calls a peaceful protest opposing the University's repression of pro-Palestine speech and draconian anti-protest rules, to be held on Wednesday, 22 October 2025 at 12pm outside the Raymond Priestly Building.
2. UMSU invites the student groups active in the on-campus Palestine movement to endorse and collaborate with UMSU on this protest.
3. Students' Council directs the UMSU President and CEO to publicise the rally on UMSU social media accounts and mailing list.

Lottie exercised moving rights. Lottie noted that the peaceful protest will bring together different pro-Palestine groups, petitions, and letters together.

Bella exercised seconding rights. Bella added that the motion is important considering the context of anti-protest rules in the University, that was imposed unilaterally by the University's Vice-Chancellor. Bella also referred to similar new university measures across the country, as another context for why the motion is important.
