5. Correspondence

5.1. OpSub Minutes & Update

Kevin spoke to two OpSub meetings since the previous Council. The OpSub meetings were for approving expenditure requested by People of Colour Department, IDAHOBIT-related activities, and Media's print Farrago.

5.2. Mauritian Students Society Appeal

Discussed after item 9.1.

Chair noted that the meeting has missed Correspondence item 5.2 concerning the Mauritian Students Society disaffiliation appeal. Chair read out the email appeal.

Hanny explained that the disaffiliation was due to MSS not meeting the minimum membership requirement of 30 members. While C&S is sympathetic, Council did set C&S Regulations that the minimum number of members needs to be 30 for an UMSU affiliated club. If clubs do not fulfil that requirement, C&S needs to expend resources towards these 200 clubs, and has to make decisions as to allocating finite resources as a result.

Hanny added that as per C&S Regulations r6.6(b)(iii), upon receipt of appeal under c 16.2, the original decision of the committee is suspended, until Council makes a decision on the appeal. This means that during this appeal period, MSS is still entitled to act and receive UMSU support as an affiliated club. The appeal was

received on 21 Apr 2024, but MSS is still below the minimum membership requirement as of this morning.

Azalea added that prior to the disaffiliation decision made by the Committee, there was a petition that gave an extra two weeks to get 6 members (from 24, which is the Society's current membership number).

Leon supported C&S' decision and noted their generosity in giving the Society extra time.

Sara noted that most Mauritian students start in Semester 2. Suggested allowing the appeal but providing probation.

Mehul supported Sara's suggestion, and suggested considering the actual size of the Mauritian student body in relation of club size.

Harrishman asked whether there is a possibility for disaffiliated clubs to become affiliated again?

Azalea responded – yes, clubs need to wait for 12m for that to lapse, then reapply for affiliation.

Justine noted that the MSS is cultural club that is representing a specific culture, recommended taking some sensitivity and consideration.

Hanny explained that the intention of C&S is not to be insensitive, but complying with regulations, as C&S has a tight budget catering to 200 clubs. If clubs are not able to meet the minimum requirement, unfortunately this is the decision that C&S has to make. Also pointed out that UMSU international also has a history of providing support for small non-qualifying groups of international students/clubs.

Azalea explained that suspending grants will mean no money to run events, which means the club remains non-functional. She added that the MSS' last event was run in March, and they did not try to run more events after.

- 9. Operational Business
 - 9.1. SIG Applications

Chair spoke to the four applications received prior to Council. She noted that there is \$1000 left in SIG pool for Semester 1. Three applicants asked for the maximum grant amount of \$1000, whereas the VCA magazine applicant asked for \$950. Council can accept, reject, or amend the amount requested by applicants.

Leon asked Southbank Officers how the EP Practice Release Showcase application will be useful to students. Justine responded that students have access to limited instruments, which belong to the University. These instruments are only available for use during class time. Whether those instruments can be used beyond class time or performances off site is up to individual teacher discretion, but typically this does not happen. Furthermore, instrument major are likely to have their own instruments anyway.

Leon suggested granting \$250 to each of the applicants.

Bella suggested granting \$1000 to the VCA SCRAP magazine.

Harrishman suggested granting \$700 to VCA SCRAP magazine, \$300 to EP.

Mehul suggested that the magazine may also apply for the next round of SIG for its Semester 2 printing costs.

Angus suggested granting \$300 to EP for software costs, noted that asking \$700 for a microphone is unnecessary, as AVM can lend mics. Furthermore, software should be free for educational purposes if not commercial purpose.

Kevin reminded Councillors to consider how much extra outreach UMSU is building for the money provided through SIG. Medical dinners are decently sized events, so \$100 would be good in return for some advertising and engagement. He invited Media OBs to speak about printing costs for the magazine.

Joel responded that printing costs for magazine seem reasonable assuming they are using University printers. He added that UMSU has a constitutional obligation to support student media initiatives, and that there is an initiative budget line within Media's budget. He suggested that applications for VCA SCRAP could speak with Media OBs to lower printing costs.

Harrishman suggested granting \$100 to each of the medical dinners, \$200 to EP, and \$600 to VCA SCRAP magazine.
