### 10. Motions on Notice

### 10.1. UMSU Stance: Voice to Parliament – 'Yes, but...'

Hiba Adam (mover) spoke to the drafting of the motion below and expressed her disappointment in the lack of engagement from Student Representatives during internal consultation on the shaping and development of the stance.

This stance was developed by Harley and Hiba with the assistance of Sara.

The Referendum date is three weeks away, and requests the council pass the motion to allow for some action to be taken prior to the date.

Evie requested that the wording be changed from "Yes, but..." to "Yes, and...". Hiba noted that the wording of the motion title was developed in consultation with the Indigenous OB, and that the language was carefully considered and chosen. The proposed amendment is not amenable for the mover.

Rose Power notes the lack of a voting member who is Indigenous who will be voting on the motion, and therefore recommends that the proposed language stands, and that Councillors vote with that in mind.

Bella spoke to her support for the motion.

Ngaire Bogemann spoke to their experience as an Indigenous person during the current debate, and their disengagement with the UMSU internal consultation process, and requested that UMSU acts, both as an organisation and as individuals, as an ally in this debate.

Hiba clarified that the previous naming and shaming of those who did not engage in the internal consultation was regarding non-Indigenous Office Bearers.

Raphael Duffy noted his support for the motion and support for UMSU taking a clear YES stance.

Motion 8: On the 14th of October Australia will vote in a yes/no referendum to include an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice in the Constitution of Australia, giving First Nations Peoples a permanent platform in policy making and legislation.

UMSU as a student union and an activist organization acknowledge that not all First Nations Peoples will be voting yes in the upcoming referendum, and the shortcoming of the Voice to Parliament. However, we also acknowledge the Uluru Statement from the Heart and First Nations Peoples who are voting yes.

UMSU is taking the position of 'Yes, but...'. While the Voice to Parliament is a step towards the implementation of the Uluru Statement from the heart and ensuring First Nations Peoples' voices are included into legislation, we recognize that this is not enough.

Phoebe Churches asked if, if the council votes to suspend Harley, what is the plan for the office with a casual vacancy?

Brittney Henderson noted that there would be no practical difference with no person in the office. Further, with recent changes to the electoral regulations,

Phoebe clarifies that a suspension may not trigger a casual vacancy in the department, and therefore may not achieve the intention of the motion and letter.

Brittney responds by agreeing that the intention of the letter was a termination, not a suspension and agrees to amend the motion to reflect a termination.

Phoebe notes that, with the new electoral regulations in place it may be appropriate to speak to Harley and see if they would prefer to resign.

Hiba further clarifies this point and mentions that Harley does not mind if they resign or are terminated but defers to the Indigenous Student representatives and motion movers to choose whether to continue with the termination or to approach Harley first.

The mover and seconder of the motion noted that communicating with Harley may not be possible, based on recent attempts.

Hope requested a motion to be moved to pay the Gundi Bunjil team, however Disha requested that be taken out of council to be organised.

Motion 9: That Council suspends Harley Lewis as UMSU Indigenous Office Bearer, due to their inability to support indigenous Students Voice.
