10.2. Full support for NTEU industrial action at the University of Melbourne

Preamble:

UMSU recognises the importance of a strong and supportive university community, where students and staff members can work together to achieve shared goals and outcomes.

UMSU acknowledges the university will create a false dichotomy between the interests of students and staff members, by framing the industrial action as detrimental to students.

UMSU recognises that this narrative seeks to pit students against our comrades at the NTEU and undermines their collective efforts to achieve fair and just outcomes for both students and staff.

Action:

UMSU will play an active role in the NTEU's decision to strike at the University of Melbourne and commits to communicate the importance of fair working conditions and job security for university staff members to the student body.

Lastly, UMSU will encourage students to support the NTEU's industrial action to achieve fair and just outcomes for all members of the university community.

10.3. UMSU seeks to protect student democracy and unionism at the University of Melbourne

Preamble:

The University of Melbourne has recently announced the establishment of a Melbourne Student Forum (MSF), a focus group that aims to listen to student voices. While UMSU supports all efforts made by the University to engage with students, we believe that the MSF has no application to all significant decisions and consultation at the University. As a well-established democratic representative body with over 55-000 member and 100 democratically elected student representatives, UMSU believes that it is the only legitimate voice of students at the University of Melbourne.

Furthermore, UMSU is concerned that the MSF has the potential to undermine the voice of students instead of amplifying them. As a university-initiated and led process, it may be used in ways that displace student led initiatives. UMSU believes that this is against the "students as partners" model that the university has

previously put forward. We welcome a statement from the University clarifying its position on this matter.

UMSU is also concerned that the establishment of the MSF may be part of a wider move in the tertiary sector to displace democratically elected student representation. We do not want the University to pick who speaks for us – we want to choose and keep democratic student representation alive.

UMSU calls upon the University to unequivocally and publicly state its respect for student democracy at the University of Melbourne and it willingness to partner with UMSU to elevate the voices of students.

Action:

- Ensure student democracy is respected and maintained at the University of Melbourne
- 2. Enhance existing structures that are genuinely student led.
- 3. Consolidate or compliment the MSF with existing structures to provide genuine student-university partnerships.
- 4. Prevent any moves to displace democratically elected student representation and ensure that UMSU remains the legitimate voice of students at the University of Melbourne.

Carlos and Mary spoke to their meeting rights. Mentioned that the Education Department is starting up 'UMSU Assemblies' to create an open forum for students to attend and raise issues to their elected representatives, asked that Councillors get involved and attend. Will set a good precedent to tell the university to "fuck off".

Councillors discussed the chances that the University's forum would be successful in the long term, however determined that regardless UMSU must contest it as it undermines the role elected representatives serve the student body.

10.5. Oppose the Far Right

Preamble:

Kellie-Jay Keen aka 'Posie Parker' is one of the most recognisable and active antitrans activists in the UK and she has recently announced a speaking tour of Australia and NZ. Keen insists she is not part of the right – cloaking her vile politics with a veneer of "women's rights" with one of her key slogans being "let women speak".

Her far-right positions become obvious when her associates are revealed; keen has given interviews with, posed for photos with, or appeared on the podcasts and shows of:

- Proudboy activists, including one participant in the January 6th capitol hill riot.
- Far right Hungarian politician, Holocaust denier, and Islamophobe Hans Lysglimt Johansen
- Canadian white-supremacist Jean-François Gariépy
- American right-wing talk show host Tucker Carlson

She actively campaigns against transgender people having their gender recognised by the state, against drag performances and against trans people using public bathrooms aligning with their gender. She compared schools letting trans kids use the correct bathroom to social engineering and called trans people and their supporters a 'cult.'

So evidently, she is a far-right bigot who needs to be opposed along with her links to the right. Figures of the political right claim their transphobia is motivated by concern for women and children and claim to represent majority opinion — which is why protests which oppose the proliferation and emboldening of right-wing ideas and their perpetrators.

The protest called by the National Union of Students Queer department is an important event for all left-wing people who want to fight transphobia and the farright. It's happening at 12pm on Saturday, March 18th at the State Library. This Facebook event is here: https://fb.me/e/3c2jZz3RZ. UMSU as a political body that represents students should endorse and put resources into building this rally.

1. Opposes the Australian and New Zealand tour of far right and transphobic British commentator Kellie-Jay Keen

2. UMSU endorses National Union of Students 'Fight the Right: protest the speaking tour of right-wing UK transphobe Kellie-Jay Keen' Rally

10.6. UMSU endorses the NUS 'Get a room - students for affordable housing' campaign.

Preamble:

The National Union of Students Education Office has called for immediate action to fix the rental crisis that students and young people face across Australia.

Students in Australia are feeling the brunt of the cost-of-living crisis, and in this crisis, housing is becoming more inaccessible. The latest census revealed a million empty dwellings across Australia, yet students and other renters are struggling to find a place to live or pay the rent. Governments have created this crisis by refusing to build adequate public housing and allowing landlords to buy up investment properties that then sit empty. Our universities have made things worse by selling off their accommodation to private providers that take advantage of students, who are forced to pay through the roof for inadequate shared accommodation.

The NUS Education Office has launched a campaign "Get A Room - Students for Affordable Housing". UMSU should endorse this campaign as a nationwide effort to fight for housing as a human right, and not something that is to drain the pockets of students.

In Melbourne, rents have and will continue to increase. For example, there has been a 21.1% increase in rents in Carlton in the past month to \$534.23 a week. This is accompanied by a 20% increase in the median weekly cost of renting an apartment in Melbourne, while in inner Melbourne rents have reached a weekly median of \$490 a week. With the spike in rents, property developers see this housing crisis as an opportunity to cash in - Yugo, a global provider for student accommodation, says

there are real opportunities for investors to get into the growing Purpose-Built Student Accommodation sector in Australia.

Property developers are not on the side of students, and neither are the University management and Vice-Chancellors. The University of Melbourne has \$10.59 billion in assets, while Vice-Chancellor Duncan Maskell has a \$1.5 million salary. While students are barely able to pay rent whilst studying, University Management and Maskell are making up towards millions and billions of dollars within their various assets, investments and salaries.

The "Get A Room - Students for Affordable Housing" national campaign opposes those who exploit students through the increasing of rents, demands an end to rent hikes through a two-year rent freeze and rent reductions, capping student housing at 30% of income, abolishing the market in private student accommodation, and building public housing.

- 2. UMSU condemns the for-profit private student housing providers, all of whom take exorbitant amounts of students money for poor-quality housing
- 3. UMSU condemns the ridiculous prices of the University colleges, which put an upward pressure on the cost of student housing.
