10.3. Stress Less Week

Preamble:

This workshop delivered by Pola Psychology will benefit students by providing incorporating an intersectional approach to wellbeing and marginalization. This workshop focuses on supporting BIPOC students to support their own and others mental health and wellbeing, it will help students understand how to advocate for self and others while engaged with mental health services and understanding the impact of a marginalised identity and intersectionality on mental health. this serves the purposes of UMSU People of Colour UMSU Welfare and UMSU Disabilities by supporting students of colour in engaging in conversations about mental health and understanding how their identities impact those conversations.

The funds will allow the workshop to go ahead as part of stress less week. People of Colour is contributing \$330, and Welfare is contributing \$330, and Disabilities is contributing \$330.

10.4. Support for Sudan

Preamble:

Sudan has been experiencing ongoing political and economic instability, as well as humanitarian crisis. Inflation, food shortage, inability to access banks and the internet. It was only a few days before the end of Ramadan, where countless

innocent people have lost their lives, homes, and country due to the senseless fighting of the military and Rapid Support Force militia in the country to take away from civilian rule the primary reason behind the 2019 revolution.

The ongoing crisis in Sudan is resulting in the loss of countless lives and having a devastating impact on the Sudanese people, people have no more access to medical supplies, necessities, electricity, or water.

Millions remain trapped in their homes, hundreds of bodies are scattered on the streets, many people are forced to split up their families and seek asylum in nearby countries, not knowing when they'd be able to come back home.

This is not a civil war; this is a war between two men with big egos and foreign influence that wants control and influence over Sudan's rich resources while disregarding its citizens.

Taking action to support those affected by this crisis is crucial, and the University of Melbourne is urged to stand in solidarity with the people of Sudan.

The media to no one's surprise has been focusing on evacuating diplomats and have been largely ignoring the scale of the crisis to the people of Sudan.

UMSU commits to amplifying the voices of those most affected by the crisis and recognizes the importance of advocacy.

UMSU calls on the Australian Government and the international community to take immediate action to support the people of Sudan and work towards a peaceful resolution to the crisis.

Stances:

- UMSU stands in solidarity with the Sudanese community and calls for an end for the war in Sudan.
- UMSU maintains that this is not a civil war as this is a conflict between military and militia.
- UMSU calls on the Australian government to provide safe passage for citizens in Sudan as well as provide humanitarian-based visas for noncitizens.
- UMSU calls on the government to work with NGOs to provide medical aid and essential items for people in Sudan.
- UMSU condemns the military and rapid support forces militia and their attempts
 to destabilize civilian rule and maintains that the only legitimate Sudanese
 government is a civilian led one.

Action:

- 1. To direct the UMSU President and POC officer to release a joint statement on the situation in Sudan and the aforementioned points.
- 2. To encourage OBs and councillors to raise awareness on the situation and donation avenues to grassroots organizations.

10.5. Support for Indian Students

Preamble:

Victoria University, The University of Wollongong, Southern Cross University, Torrens University and Edith Cowan University have placed a ban on applicants from several Indian states including Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Gujrat. The University of Wollongong in March increased the conditions on entry requirements for students from and India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Lebanon, Mongolia, Nigeria.

The justification provided for these decisions by the Department of Home Affairs is that applications from these countries pose a high risk of being non-genuine.

The thin veneer of legitimation this supposed risk provides in no way justifies the overreaction. Excluding students based simply on where they come from is racist, students have a right to education regardless of their circumstances and cultural background.

UMSU has always stood against discrimination and racism and will continue to do so.

Motion:

- 1. That UMSU condemns the behaviour of the universities named in the preamble for the discrimination against Indian students.
- 2. UMSU stands in solidarity with the students who are victims of these scams conducted.
- 3. UMSU urges the university to not adopt these measures and to call on other universities to stop the racist measures.

4. To direct the President, General Secretary and POC Officer to release a statement on this issue.

10.6. Support for Freeze the HECS Indexing NUS Campaign

Preamble:

We are currently facing a significant issue in the Australian higher education system that is affecting a large number of students across the country. The government's decision to increase the Higher Education Contribution Scheme (HECS) debt by 7% is very concerning for students. This increase will exacerbate the financial burden on those who are already struggling to make ends meet. This issue disproportionately affects women and low SES students who take longer to pay off their loans and are thus having them compounded over longer periods of time, especially when wage increases have been and remain stagnant while cost of living increases. Moreover, the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) not only affects domestic students but also impacts the increase in university fees for international students, which are already ridiculously high, making higher education even more inaccessible for those who are already disadvantaged. In this context, the NUS Freeze the HECS Indexing NUS Campaign has been instrumental in starting the conversation around the HECS indexing. The campaign has brought attention to the negative impact of HECS indexing and has galvanized support from students and other stakeholders across the country. It is crucial that we continue to advocate for fair and accessible higher education for all and urge the government to reconsider their decision to increase HECS debt. We must work towards a system that ensures equitable access to education for all students, regardless of their socio-economic background or gender.
