
ENTRANCE GALLERY *Womens Art Register: Setting up shop in the GPG* EXHIBITION DATES: 17-27 May 2022



Women's Art Register: Setting up shop in the GPG Members of the Women's Art Register, coordinated by Caroline Phillips



Set up in 1975 in the George Paton Gallery, the Women's Art Register is now the longest running, artistrun archive of women's art practice in the world, and is designated a *Collection of National Significance*. Since its inception the Women's Art Register has compiled educational kits for use in schools and libraries throughout Australia, undertaken research, and published a bi-annual magazine (The Women's Art Register Bulletin).

Through the decades, this grass-roots, living community of contemporary artists has produced a number of major exhibitions and projects to educate and inform broad audiences, support its community of members, and advocate for women's art and artists. We now reinhabit this site to collaborate with George Paton Gallery once more for this historic *Feminisms* exhibition. We have temporarily set up shop, continuing our work of archiving works from the past and the present, sharing the narratives and images of thousands of women artists, and amplifying their voices.
