Kayleigh Goh paints contemplative architectural spaces with the use of cement and wood.




Leanne Bock explores constructed realities and existential abstractions through themes of the everyday and philosophies of play.



Rachel O'Connor is interested in how words mediate readings and understanding of the human body.




