

GUIDELINES FOR A HAPPY, HEALTHY AND SAFE



Welcome to your creative community on campus. These Guidelines aim to help you understand everyone's responsibilities for participation in this vibrant community.

First things first

- Incorporate an Acknowledgement of Country at the start of rehearsals, meetings, before a performance, in promotion/social media
- Respect and value the diversity of the people you work with
- Consider access and inclusion from the beginning of your process
- Student participation is voluntary and should always aim to be fun
- Love your planet and think sustainably about all aspects of your production
- Be organised and plan things well in advance!

Your responsibilities

- Conduct yourself in a respectful manner, communicating with courtesy and kindness
- Hold open auditions and encourage diversity in casting to reflect our community
- Listen and treat people's concerns as legitimate handle sensitive or confronting content responsibly
- Respect people's boundaries and sensitivities
- If you're a performer, remember it's your responsibility to look after your own mental health: recognise and communicate your potential triggers
- Follow intimacy guidelines, understand and seek consent for intimate and physical work
- Treat people professionally
- Always prioritise safety, never place cast or crew in a dangerous situation
- Display trigger or content warnings on audition packs, websites, Facebook pages, ticketing sites and in the foyer – ask UHT or the Creative Arts Officers for help if you need
- Enact all Covidsafe measures and abide by current regulations
- Familiarise yourself with the University's Code of Conduct and understand how it applies to your process

Code of Conduct

In accordance the **University's Code of Conduct you must not**:

- Engage in improper behaviour, including harassment, threatening or intimidating behaviour
- Behave aggressively (door slamming, "storming out", yelling and swearing)
- Engage in physical or emotional violence
- Attend rehearsals, meetings, shows or other production related meets under the influence of drugs or alcohol





Handy tips for smooth sailing

- Create an Info & Audition Pack to help performers understand what they will be required to do, this is especially important if your play deals with challenging themes
- Initiate check-in processes throughout rehearsals to get a sense of how people are feeling
- Create space for people to share information about their identity; for example you can ask for people's personal pronouns in early rehearsals or even in the audition process
- Determine early if anyone in your cast/crew or band require support for access
- Set up clear lines of communication for cast, crew and production teams
- Have a process in place for communicating lateness and availability issues
- Give at least 1 week's notice of rehearsals
- Provide information about your Production Week early in the process
- Have realistic time commitment expectations for your (volunteer) production team
- Take regular breaks throughout rehearsals
- Acknowledge we all make mistakes and admit when you could use a little help!
- Delegate and trust that people will do a good job
- Be flexible
- We work closely with one-another so remember good personal hygiene
- Find ways to socialise and relax together
- Celebrate your successes!



Need help?

If someone breaches the guidelines, you are empowered to:

- Approach the person directly
- Approach your designated representative

If you don't feel comfortable to do that, you can also approach the Artistic Director of Union House Theatre or the Creative Arts Officers.
